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
Reading

Reading continues to be at the heart of our curriculum. Following some recent parent feedback, we would love to share a little insight into your child's weekly reading experience at Coaley.


Children in Robins class have a daily phonics lesson where they develop the skills to recognise sounds within words so that they can blend them together to read. All children in Robins, Starlings and Owls have a daily guided reading lesson. During these lessons, children are exposed to a range of age-appropriate texts (novels/ picture books/ non-fiction/ poetry). Adults read these texts to children, children read in small groups and at times children read independently. In guided reading, children have opportunity to answer questions about the text they have read to develop their understanding of the text. Children are listened to read multiple times during the week by class teachers, teaching assistants, leaders and volunteers. This reading is documented and recorded internally. If a child's home reading record shows that they do not read at home or a child informs us that they don't, we prioritise making time for adults to read to these children. Children enjoy listening to their class text which is read at different times during the school day.





What are the symptoms of peanut and tree nut allergy?


Thank you to everyone who attended my coffee morning last week. Here are some of the things you told us we are doing well at Coaley:

- Staff are invested in the children's best interests





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
























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
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Celebrate Neurodiversity Week
